NHS Talking Therapies: one size does NOT fit all!

NHS Talking Therapies is the new name for counselling and psychotherapy provided by the NHS (formerly known as IAPT, Improving Access to Psychological Therapies).

A previous wide range of relational therapy options has been reduced to a predominant use of short-term CBT (Cognitive Behavioural Therapy)

It's time for local communities to be given the range of mental health support we need

Let's invest in people, not manipulated data (see over)



Vita Health hold the monopoly in local NHS Talking Therapies but provide very limited choice...

- The company *Vita Health* won the **£77 million contract** for providing local NHS Talking Therapies for common mental health problems
- In 2021-22, **30,000** people asked for therapy help and **5,000** "recovered". By **manipulating** the data, this is called a 50% success rate
- Of the 21,000 people who dropped out, most won't be followed up
- Although CBT and psycho-educational groups can be helpful, they do not suit everybody, and yet they compose 94% of all therapy offered
- There is no independent evaluation of NHS Talking Therapies
- The waiting list between 1st and 2nd session is now over one year
- Burn out, depression and anxiety are common amongst therapists, reflecting the assembly-line conditions of this data-centric service

... let's bring empathy and relationship back into NHS therapy

Choice matters! Many of these therapies are not available or are restricted on the NHS:

- psychodynamic psychotherapy
- humanistic therapies
- interpersonal therapy
- art therapies
- psychoanalytic psychotherapy
- cognitive analytic therapy
- EMDR (Eye Movement Desensitisation and Reprocessing)
- family and couple (systemic) therapy
- gestalt therapy
